## HOLOCAUST SURVIVOR FILM WINS BEST DOCUMENTARY AT FLORIDA AND VIRGINIA FILM FESTIVALS

Montclair, NJ, July 31, 2020 – Despite worldwide festival delays and cancellations related to the ongoing pandemic, the summer brought much recognition for "An Inconvenient Time – The Story of Ruth Ravina," an award-winning, feature-length documentary film about a young girl's odyssey through the Holocaust.

On June 28th, "An Inconvenient Time" took home the Best Documentary Award from the Treasure Coast International Film Festival in Port St. Lucie's, Florida. Shortly after, in early July, the Bedford International Film Festival announced that the film had won Best Feature Documentary at their festival in Bedford, Virginia.

"An Inconvenient Time" premiered at the Treasure Coast International Film Festival as their closing film. Due to COVID-19 restrictions, no public film screenings took place at the Bedford International Film Festival. However, the film is expected to be screened at their 2021 festival.

Treasure Coast International Film Festival held an award ceremony with social distancing to commemorate the festival's award nominees and to announce the winners. Marcia Wilf, philanthropist and one of the film's associate executive producers, was present at the Port St. Lucie award ceremony and accepted the award on behalf of director Denny Klein and the team of filmmakers.

"An Inconvenient Time is a riveting and haunting account, offering a rare opportunity to journey through a horrible piece of history as seen through the eyes of a child," said Joe Garofalo, Executive Director of the Treasure Coast International Film Festival.

The film has also been nominated for a prestigious award at the Jersey Shore Film Festival, which plans to announce their winners in a ceremony in early August 2020.

Jersey Shore Film Festival's Founding Director, Stevie Doueck, called the film: "A very important documentary."

Directed by Denny Klein, "An Inconvenient Time" tells the story of the odyssey through the Holocaust of Ruth Ravina, who was two years old when Germany invaded Poland in 1939 and lived through three concentration camps by the age of seven. It is a story of survival and triumph.

This feature-length film contains six years of interviews and conversations between Ruth, the Klein family, her local community and the filmmakers. The film also contains breathtaking illustrations and animation to bring Ruth's story of survival to life.
